1. What is a recess appointment?
2. What is a pro-forma session and how does it prevent a congressional recess?

Answers

- 1. The president can fill a vacant position temporarily while the Senate is on recess without having to go through the approval process. This appointment only lasts until the Senate is back in session.
- 2. A pro-forma session is a brief meeting held every fourth day to prevent the Senate from being considered in recess. Only two people, one Senator and a clerk, need to be present to conduct a proforma session. At each pro-forma session, the Senate adjourns for three days. Adjourning for four days or more would cause the Senate to be considered in recess.
- 3. The Nuclear Option reduced the number of Senators required to approve a presidential nomination from two-thirds to one half plus one.
- 4. Judicial impeachment is a process whereby a Supreme Court Justice can be impeached and removed from the bench, although historically this has never happened.
